## **MUST**

 We usually use must when we talk about necessary or important actions.

I must leave now. I don't want to be late. We must remember to take our passports.

 Mustn't = must not.
 We use mustn't when something is not allowed it is strictly forbidden.

Student's mustn't eat or drink in the classroom.

- Must not is more formal and is used in written English.
- For the past, we use had to (not must).

## **HAVE TO**

 We use have to when we talk about a rule made for us by somebody else.

We have to wear a uniform at my school.

• Have to changes to has to for he, she, it.

Paul has to do his homework now.

 We use don't have to when something is not necessary. It is not forbidden though.

We don't have to go to school tomorrow. Jim doesn't have to get up early tomorrow.

 We don't usually use must to make questions.

I must leave at 6:00 but Do I have to leave at 6:00?

✓ Use must or have to when you say what you think its necessary, when you give your opinion:

It is a fantastic film. You must see it. or You have to see it.

√ When you are not giving your personal opinion, use have to (not must)

In many countries men have to do military service.
