Countable Noun Uncountable Noun Can be counted Can not be counted Examples: Boy, laptop, school... Examples: Sugar, beauty, knowledge... Always take singular verbs Can take singular or plural verbs Examples: The flower vase is on the table. Examples: Sugar is fattening. Go with a/an/the/my, etc. in the singular Do not go with a/an/two, etc Example: She bought an umbrella. Example: I'd like to drink orange juice. Can be used alone or with some/any/many/few in the plural. Can be used alone or with some/any/much/little/the/my,etc Example: Remember to buy (some) bread. Example: I love (some) carrots. We can use a/an, one/two with uncountable nouns such as coffee, tea... when we talk about a cup, a glass, bottle.

Example: Can I have two teas, please? (two cups of tea)
